

DESCRIPTION/EXPLANATION OF FEES

District Participation Fee

Every students is required to pay a district fee of \$100 for participation in marching band and/or sports. This is a one-time annual fee. The \$100 is not required for *each* activity, but rather \$100 for *the year* regardless of how many sports/activities the student participates in. There is a family maximum of \$200 for the school year (affecting families with multiple children). This fee cover transportation (bus) and competition fees.

Equipment Fee

The District has a \$50 rental fee for the use of all school owned instruments. This is a band only fee.

Practice Flag

ONE practice flag includes:

- ONE 6-foot guard pole
- TWO sets of rubber crutches
- TWO flag tabs and
- ONE practice silk.

* If you purchase a practice flag for \$25, it is your students' to keep and does not need to be returned to the school. ** If you choose to rent a practice flag for \$15, it **MUST** be returned at the end of the marching season in the same condition (minus normal wear). If the flag is not returned, or is returned damaged beyond expected wear, there will be an additional charge of \$10 due. This fee will be due every participating year.

Marching Shoes

Purchase when needed according to student growth.

Band T-Shirt

1 required for marching season. Using current black t-shirt as used in previous marching seasons.

Parent T-Shirt

Optional – various designs to choose from and a great way to show support of your student.

M- Men's standard t-shirt \$15

W- Women's cut with V-neck \$20

Transportation Donation

Optional - Financial donation to help offset the cost of rental trucks for equipment and additional competition fees not covered by the district.

IBCF Dues

Optional - Participate in the parent foundation and help plan the success of the program.

Camp Lunches

Optional – 5 days of lunch at a total cost of \$30 (week 2 of summer camp). Individual days cannot be purchased. You can choose to purchase the lunch deal through the boosters or provide your student with a lunch for all full-day band camp days.

The largest financial burden is incurred by freshmen families, as these students are not likely to have any of the equipment listed above. Hopefully the financial burden lessens the second year, when the student already owns, dinkles (marching shoes), band t-shirt, practice flag, etc.

In accordance with Mr. Ormsbee's and the Ironwood Band Community Foundation's (IBCF) commitment to the program, **no student** will be denied participation due to financial difficulties.
